While CALL/ACBD 2015 doesn't *officially* kick off until the opening reception on Sunday evening, you don't want to miss out on the great events happening beforehand.

First off is the pre-conference workshop on Saturday, May 2nd, entitled, "Measuring for What Matters: Demonstrating Value & Operational Excellence". The presenter is Rebecca Jones, a partner at Toronto-based consulting firm Dysart & Jones where she focuses on facilitating clients' planning processes, problem-solving, organizational design, and project management.

In this workshop, Ms. Jones will rely on her experience teaching organizational measurement models throughout North America to show attendees how to identify the measurements that are most meaningful for operational purposes and decision-makers; how to use those findings to demonstrate the business value of services or to improve operations; and then how to communicate that business value to decision-makers, clients, and information services staff.

A new initiative of the conference planning committee this year is the Lightning Talks program on Sunday afternoon. These rapid-fire, seven-minutes-or-less talks will cover a wide range of topics, including the creation of an in-house annotated statute, the scholarships and awards available through CALL, the SCC Library's "tips of the week" service, using the flipped classroom model to teach legal research, blogging in law libraries, and digitization on a shoestring budget.

La présentatrice sera Rebecca Jones, une partenaire travaillant pour Dysart & Jones, une société d'experts-conseils de Toronto, où elle vise à faciliter les processus de planification, la résolution de problèmes, la conception organisationnelle et la gestion de projet pour les clients. Au cours de cet atelier, Mme Jones s'appuiera sur son expérience dans l'enseignement des modèles de mesure organisationnels partout en Amérique du Nord pour montrer aux participants la façon de déterminer les mesures les plus importantes à des fins opérationnelles et pour les décideurs, d'utiliser ces conclusions pour démontrer la valeur opérationnelle des services ou pour améliorer les opérations et de communiquer ensuite cette valeur opérationnelle aux décideurs, aux clients et aux employés des services d'information.

Les présentations éclair prévues le dimanche après-midi sont une nouvelle initiative du comité de planification de la conférence de cette année. Ce feu roulant d'exposés de moins de sept minutes couvriront un large éventail de sujets, notamment la création d'une loi annotée maison, les bourses et les prix disponibles par l'entremise de l'ACBD, les conseils de la semaine de la bibliothèque de la Cour suprême du Canada, l'utilisation du modèle inversé pour enseigner la recherche juridique, le blogage dans les bibliothèques de droit et la numérisation malgré un budget restreint.

Committee to Promote Research

CALL/ACBD invites members to apply for the CALL/ACBD Research Grant which provides financial assistance to support members who wish to do research on a topic of interest to members and to the association, and which would promote an understanding of legal information sources or law librarianship.

Proposed research projects need not be large or formal; research could include surveys, bibliographic projects, pilot projects and feasibility studies. Grants have been previously awarded for a survey of the education of law librarians in Canada, a comparison of electronic citators, and a bibliography of common law materials written in French. There is not a fixed limit to the amount of the Research Grant. Recent awards have ranged from \$1400 to \$4400.

Les demandes de bourse de recherche de l'ACBD/CALL sont dues le 15 mars 2015

L'ACBD/CALL invite ses membres à présenter une demande de bourse de recherche de l'ACBD/CALL, qui fournit une aide financière aux membres qui souhaitent effectuer des recherches portant sur un sujet d'intérêt pour les membres et pour l'association, et qui favorisent la connaissance des sources d'information juridique ou de la profession de bibliothécaire de droit.

Les projets de recherche proposés ne doivent pas nécessairement être vastes ou formels; il peut s'agir, notamment, d'enquêtes, de projets bibliographiques, de projets pilotes ou d'études de faisabilité. Dans le passé, des bourses ont été octroyées pour une enquête relative à la formation des bibliothécaires de droit au Canada, une comparaison des jurilex électroniques et une bibliographie de documents de common law rédigés en français.

Aucune limite ne s'applique quant au montant de la bourse de recherche. Les bourses récemment attribuées se situaient entre 1 400 \$ et 4 400 \$.
